In attendance by telephone for the Authority's meeting were Board Members Andrew Alexander, as a voting member, Bob Adams, Paula Connors, Joya De Foor, as a voting member, and Faye Watanabe, comprising a quorum. Paula Connors served as chair. The meeting was called to order.

Executive Director, Edward Becker attended by telephone. John Stoecker, Lee McCormick, Ben Barker, Anthony Stubbs, and Travis Cooper of Sierra Management Group L.L.C., attended by telephone as financial advisors to the Authority. Katrina Dair and Alexis Tudor of Sierra Management attended by telephone. Ron Lee, of Jones Hall, APLC, attended by telephone as counsel to the Authority.

The minutes of the meeting(s) of the Board on May 8, 2020 were discussed and approved. Motion by Watanabe; Seconded by De Foor; Motion carries by a roll call vote, without abstentions.

There was no public comment.

The Executive Director reminded the Board that recommendations to the Board on agenda items were made on the respective staff reports provided and the Executive Director reiterated those recommendations.

Staff discussed the fourth amendment to the CMFA PACE Program Report and Handbook. Public comments were made by Boris Piskin and Andrew Gold.

Motion by De Foor; Seconded by Watanabe; Motion carries by a roll call vote, without abstentions.

Staff discussed the release of notices of non-renewal to CMFA C-PACE Program Administrators. Public comments were made by Boris Piskin and Andrew Gold.

Motion by Watanabe; Seconded by Alexander; Motion carries by a roll call vote, without abstentions.

Staff discussed an initial resolution (resolution 20-061) to issue up to \$35,000,000 in multifamily housing revenue bonds for 5th Street Partnership LLC, (5th St. PSH Apartments), City of Los Angeles, County of Los Angeles.

Motion by Watanabe; Seconded by Alexander; Motion carries by a roll call vote, without abstentions.

Staff discussed a final resolution (resolution 20-062) to issue up to \$10,100,000 in multifamily housing revenue bonds for Walnut Street, L.P., (Walnut Studios Apartments), City of San Carlos, County of San Mateo.

Motion by Watanabe; Seconded by De Foor; Motion carries by a roll call vote, without abstentions.

Staff discussed a final resolution (resolution 20-063) to issue up to \$38,000,000 in multifamily housing revenue bonds for Alameda Point Family, L.P., a California limited partnership, (Alameda Point Family Apartments), City of Alameda, County of Alameda.

Staff discussed a final resolution (resolution 20-064) to issue up to \$60,000,000 in multifamily housing revenue bonds for Village Pointe Community Partner, LP, (Village Pointe Apartments), City of Lancaster, County of Los Angeles.

Staff discussed a final resolution (resolution 20-066) to issue up to \$55,000,000 in tax-exempt loans for Harbor Day School, a California nonprofit public benefit corporation, City of Newport Beach, County of Orange.

Staff discussed a final resolution (resolution 20-067) to issue up to \$10,000,000 in revenue anticipation notes for Highlands Community Charter and Technical Schools, City of Sacramento, County of Sacramento.

Staff discussed a final resolution (resolution 20-068) to issue up to \$5,000,000 in revenue anticipation notes for Empire Springs Charter School, City of Rancho Cucamonga, County of San Bernardino.

Staff discussed a final resolution (resolution 20-069) to issue up to \$8,000,000 in revenue anticipation notes for River Springs Charter School, Inc., City of Temecula, County of Riverside.

Staff discussed a resolution (resolution 20-071) to establish CMFA Community Facilities District No. 2020-2, Truckee Development Associates, LLC, (Town of Truckee – Truckee Railyard) and to levy a special tax to finance certain public facilities therein.

Motion by Adams; Seconded by De Foor; Motion carries by a roll call vote, without abstentions.

Staff discussed a resolution (resolution 20-072) to incur up to \$22,000,000 in bonded indebtedness for CMFA Community Facilities District No. 2020-2, Truckee Development Associates, LLC, (Town of Truckee – Truckee Railyard).

Motion by De Foor; Seconded by Adams; Motion carries by a roll call vote, without abstentions.

A public hearing was opened regarding the formation, bond issuance and appropriation limits for proposed California Municipal Finance Authority Community Facilities 2020-1 (City of Rocklin – Sierra Pine) And Future Annexation Area, and improvement areas therein.

The public hearing was closed.

Staff discussed a resolution (resolution 20-073) forming the California Municipal Finance Authority Community Facilities District No. 2020-1 (City of Rocklin – Sierra Pine).
